I. Executive Summary



Impaired driving is clearly a deadly national epidemic. During 2004, the last year for which complete national statistics are available, nearly 13,000 people were killed on America's roads in crashes involving drivers with a BAC of .08 or higher. During the same year the FBI's Uniform Crime Report notes that 1.4 million drivers were arrested for driving under the influence.

The alcohol-related fatality rate in New Jersey is traditionally below the national average. However, too many lives continue to be lost on the roads of New Jersey because of impaired driving, so enforcement and educational efforts must remain a priority.

Nationally, one person every 40 minutes, 35 people a day, die in alcohol-related crashes. This is unacceptable.

In 2006 the New Jersey Division of Highway Traffic Safety mobilized the entire law enforcement community in the state for an impaired driving campaign as part of the national "Over the Limit...Under Arrest" Crackdown. The crackdown, which ran from August 18-September 4, 2006, and focused on the Labor Day holiday weekend, called on law enforcement to conduct high-visibility drunk driving checkpoints and roving patrols during the two-week campaign.

In New Jersey, the decision was made to continue utilizing the previous slogan for the impaired driving crackdown: You Drink and Drive, You Lose. This decision was made for a variety of factors, including the fact that the NHTSA decision to change the slogan was made late in the planning process for the campaign. In addition, the Division had an inventory of educational and promotional items bearing the You Drink and Drive, You Lose slogan. And, the law enforcement community in the state has begun to identify and recognize the You Drink and Drive, You Lose slogan, so it seemed unwise to change at this time.

The results of the 2006 campaign show that the law enforcement community in the state again answered the call and sent a strong message that impaired driving will not be tolerated on the roads of New Jersey and that efforts will continue until drunk driving is completely eradicated.

Highlights of New Jersey's You Drink and Drive, You Lose 2006 Crackdown are as follows:

- A total of 391 police agencies participated in the two-week crackdown compared to 382 in 2005.



- 64 law enforcement agencies received You Drink and Drive You Lose campaign grants from the Division of Highway Traffic Safety to assist in carrying out the campaign.
- A total of 1,721 DWI arrests were made during the two-week crackdown compared to 1,583 in 2005.
- The total number of other summonses (Open Container, Traffic Signal, Speeding, Seat Belt, Child Restraint, Equipment, Cell Phone, Other Moving, Other Non Moving) issued during the campaign was 69,835 compared to 50,665 in 2004.
- There were 8,704 speeding summonses and 6,211 seat belt citations issued during the two-week period.
- The campaign was supported by public awareness activities that included radio announcements and news conference events in the New York City and Philadelphia media markets.


II. Background

We have come a long way in the last 25 years in the war against impaired driving. Having “one for the road” is no longer socially acceptable, and it seems clear that most responsible people understand the dangers of drinking and driving. Nonetheless, the statistics indicate that the message is not hitting home with the right people. Heavy alcohol users and repeat offenders carry much of the burden. It is known that most habitual offenders on average drive drunk many times before being caught, putting all roadway users at extreme risk.

The vast majority of Americans, 97% of those surveyed in fact, indicate that they feel impaired driving is a major threat to themselves and their families. Also, the vast majority of Americans support stronger drunk driving laws. NHTSA estimates that three in every ten Americans will be involved in an impaired driving crash at some point in their lifetime.





Planning for New Jersey's You Drink and Drive, You Lose 2006 Crackdown began in late 2005, when a detailed plan of action and timeline was developed. The plan of action was used to carry out all components of the campaign, including the development and distribution of educational materials, the soliciting and processing of grant applications, outreach to all police agencies to secure participation in the crackdown, and the earned media component of the program.

All 473 police agencies in New Jersey were asked to participate in the 2006 You Drink and Drive, You Lose Crackdown on either a funded or non funded basis. Based on available funding levels, approximately 60 departments were offered You Drink and Drive, You Lose grants to support efforts locally. Along with the letters of invitation, grant packets, and educational materials, each department received a crackdown enforcement reporting form to be filled out and returned prior to September 15, 2006.

Agencies that received You Drink and Drive, You Lose Crackdown grants were awarded \$3,000, which provided funding for 60 hours of enforcement overtime during the crackdown period. The funding was to be utilized by the grantees for DWI checkpoints and/or roving patrols. Agencies were also encouraged to make use of their available DDEF funding during the two week campaign.

III. Results

When all reporting forms and data were tabulated, it was determined that 391 police agencies had participated in the campaign, which is an increase as compared to the 382 agencies that participated in 2005, and the 102 that took part in 2004.

As the result of this concerted effort to elicit participation from the local departments, the response to the crackdown effort was greater than ever before. A total of 391 police departments participated. This represents 82.6% percent of the total police agencies in the state.

The table that follows summarizes the results of the enforcement component of the campaign. During the two week You Drink and Drive, You Lose 2006 Crackdown, the 391 participating police departments made 1,721 DWI arrests. They also issued 8,704 speeding summonses, 6,211 seat belt citations, and 54,920 other citations.

IV. Media



In any statewide traffic safety enforcement crackdown there needs to be a strong campaign of public information and awareness. The Division, in cooperation with its law enforcement partners, raised awareness about the 2006 You Drink and Drive, You Lose Crackdown in several important ways.

A pair of news conference were held, one in each of the major media markets serving the state, to raise awareness about the campaign. The crackdown was formally launched at a press conference held in Times Square, New York City, on August 18, 2006. A second news conference, targeting the Philadelphia media market, was held in Upper Pittsgrove Township, NJ on August 25, 2006 in partnership with The Hero Campaign for Designated Drivers. Both media events were well covered by television, radio, and print journalists, which served to raise awareness about the DWI crackdown.

Thousands of radio listeners heard the You Drink and Drive, You Lose message courtesy of radio announcements produced by the Division and aired before and during the campaign. The announcements ran repeatedly on every New Jersey radio station as part of the Division's ongoing partnership with the New Jersey Broadcasters Association.

Participating police agencies also helped spread the word. Grant recipients were asked to send out press releases highlighting their participation in the campaign as well as hang banners around their communities to promote the crackdown. Dozens of news stories ran in local newspapers as a result of these press releases, which undoubtedly brought the impaired driving message to many thousands of residents

Another driver who authorities say was drunk damaged the memorial by plowing into it July 20.

"Lightning struck trees on this site" said

father and an Egg Harbor Township resident. "Once it took the life of our son. The second time, it broke our hearts."

State and local officials joined Bill Elliott on Friday for a ceremony to rededicate the memorial, which consists of a three-foot cross with a plaque on the ground.

After the repaired memorial was unveiled, Bill Elliott hugged Assemblyman Nelson T. Albano, D-Vineland. Albano's son,

in December 2001 by an intoxicated motorist who had four previous drunken driving convictions.

John Elliott's death led to the passage of "John's Law," which requires police to impound a drunken driver's vehicle for up to 12 hours.

John Elliott was killed by a driver who had been arrested earlier that night for drunken driving but was released to the custody of a friend, who returned him to his car.

Bill Elliott and his wife, Muriel, have dedicated themselves to combating drunken driving.

In addition to lobbying for legislation, they start-

for Designated Drivers.

The campaign has led to restaurants, bars and other alcohol-serving institutions offering free soda or water to designated drivers.

"When we said goodbye to our son, we made a promise to ensure there is no more drunken driving in America," Bill Elliott said.

The driver who killed John Elliott — Michael Pangle, 37, of Woodstown — also died in the crash.

The driver who crashed his car into the roadside memorial last month — Robert F. Mattson Jr., 38, of Elk — was charged with drunken

Police targeting drunken drivers

Three local police departments receive grants for crackdown

Hopalong police nabbed one drunken driver over the weekend, but that could be just the first in the borough as part of an \$11 million statewide crackdown through Labor Day weekend.

Police departments are paying extra patrols and setting up sobriety checkpoints with federal grants for the "Drunk Driving: Over the Limit, Under Arrest" campaign from Aug. 18 to Sept. 4. The campaign is sponsored by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and is the largest crackdown on drunken driving in United States history, NHTSA spokeswoman Ely Martin said.

Repeating, Hardyston and Franklin each received a \$1,000 grant to pay additional patrols, whose sole responsibility is to watch for drunken drivers, police said.

Although police arrest intoxicated drivers throughout the year, the two-

week program is designed to send a message about the dangers of driving drunk and legal consequences, officials said.

The timing of the program coincides with the finish of summer travel and holidays, Franklin Chief Joseph Kettle said.

"I think they're putting out the message that drunk driving through Labor Day weekend is not acceptable," he said.

Also, there are many alcohol-fueled parties among county youth at the end of summer, police said. Officers would like more people to call a taxi or use designated drivers, Hardyston Patrolman Ed O'Rourke said.

"If we can even save one life, it will make it worth it," he said.

The program began Friday, but Franklin will not implement the campaign until later this week, Kettle said. The department will set up checkpoints

to review driver credentials and look for signs of intoxication.

Hardyston will begin paying patrols this week on evenings drinking nights around the township, O'Rourke said.

In Hopalong, there will be one extra patrolman on campaign days, Lt. Michael Sciarano said. Through patrols arrested one intoxicated driver during

the first weekend of the crackdown.

Repeating police put out a release last week saying it will enforce the "You Drink, You Drive, You Lose" campaign, but NHTSA's Martin said that is the former name for this year's "Under Arrest" crackdown.

"This tagline is more blunt, more forceful," she said. "We're identifying

everything. We're taking the gloves off."

The program incorporates 11,000 law enforcement agencies nationwide, including sheriff's offices, local police, and others, Martin said.

The crackdown began just days after the release of 2005 alcohol impaired driving data, which said there were 16,800 alcohol-related fatalities in traffic crashes nationwide, a figure that remains "nearly unchanged during the last decade," the NHTSA said.

Repeating police did not receive a special grant for the two-week campaign, but the department will install extra patrols using existing (PI) enforcement funds, Chief Raymond Rafferty said.

"We're educating the public to let them know the police have not given up on (PI) enforcement throughout the

Our View

You drink and drive - we all lose

It should be a no-brainer - "You drink and drive, you lose."

But once again, New Jersey feels the need to step up enforcement against intoxicated drivers in an August-September campaign with a title that puts it pointedly, "You drink and drive, you lose."

Fear of penalties, fear of arrests - that is the heavy hand that New Jersey cops find it takes to keep some potential intoxicated drivers off the road, calling a taxi or designating a sober friend for a ride home from the bar.

But when you really think about it, should it take fear of punishment to keep ordinary citizens from taking the risk that with alcohol, they might transform themselves into killers on the road?

The Kinnelon community knows all too well the human cost of a suspected drunken driving.

In a memorial service last Tuesday, the parents of Mayada Jafar marked what would have been the Kinnelon High School student's sweet 16th birthday with a memorial attended by friends, family and residents at Our Lady of the Magnificat Church.

Instead of marking their daughter's milestones through life - high school graduation and perhaps college, marriage and children some day - her parents have to comfort themselves in the memories and love shown by the community.

A song played at the memorial might have been a good-bye from her parents on her wedding day. But

due to the actions of an alleged drunken driver, who police say struck Mayada and her cousin, killing them both on April 20, it was a good-bye that cut to the heart with tragedy.

The lyrics, "Good-bye's the saddest word I'll ever hear," emphasize the real reason New Jersey police should find no offenders to charge during the "You drink and drive, you lose" campaign from Aug. 18 through Sept. 4, and that reason is love of neighbor.

Kinnelon's case is not rare. Impaired drivers kill nearly 18,000 people on American roadways annually, and in New Jersey, 31 percent of motor vehicle fatalities are related to alcohol, according to Pequannock Police, one of the participants in the upcoming campaign.

The time to decide to hand over the keys is before taking a drink. Be realistic. Don't let an alcohol-impaired state determine whether you'll make it home from the party okay. Alcohol won't tell the truth about one's condition.

"We have come a long way in the last 20 years in terms of drunk driving but the work is clearly not finished," said Roberto Rodriguez, director of the New Jersey Division of Highway Traffic Safety.

Let's surprise Rodriguez this year with a dramatic reduction in the apprehensions for drunken driving - a dramatic reduction because there are few drunks to be found - and let's do it for the right reasons.

Jacob Barton, 12, Getting Better Daily In Hospital After Being Hurt In Accident

 Jacob "Jake" Barton, 12, who was hit by a car and pinned under it while skateboarding last Wednesday, is at Cooper Hospital in Camden and improving daily.

"Jake's status at this time is that he's improving daily and they hope to have him in his own room soon," said his parents, Angela and Jerome Barton.

"The family appreciates everyone's thoughts and prayers during Jake's recovery," the parents said.

On August 9 at 7:30 p.m., Jacob was skateboarding with friends down Middlesex Street toward the river and did not see the car, driven by Andrew Eskanos, 18, of Gloucester City, traveling south on Burlington Street.

"As he (Jacob) attempted to stop his skateboard, he apparently slid into the path of the oncoming vehicle," Gloucester City Police said.

Police officers arriving on the scene found

Jacob "trapped beneath the car."

Members of the Gloucester City Fire Department and members of Camden City Rescue 1 and Battalion 1 showed up the car with airbags and jacks, and within one minute crews had rescued the child.

Jacob was taken to Cooper Trauma Center with multiple trauma to the head and body.

Westville Taxes Will Increase

 Mayor William Packer and Westville Borough Council members approved the 2006 budget in the amount of \$4,232,000 following the approval of an amendment during last week's meeting.

The good news included the awarding of \$200,000 from the NJ Department of Community Affairs for Municipal Tax Relief Extrajurisdictional Aid.

"This award should reduce the amount that must be raised by property taxes," Packer said.

Prior to award the tax

was going to amount to a 2.5-cent increase.

Now, according to the auditor Mr. Batten, the increase should be reduced to 12.5 cents per \$100 assessed value.

"The budget is higher this year due to an increase in sewer bills from the Gloucester County Municipal Authority. We are working on repairs and upgrading the sewer main to lessen the amount of sewerage sent to the authority, thereby lowering the bill amount in the future," Packer said.

"Residents should see decrease in the next quarter municipal tax bill," Borough Clerk Richard Ther

said. Packer attributed the success in obtaining the award to Assemblywoman Joseph Roberts (D-5) and to borough officials who submitted the paperwork to the state.

Council received a letter regarding the Land Use Board Hearing for Main Street Mixed Use Investments held on August 7.

Preliminary approval was granted to the developer for a 64-unit condominium construction on Broadway. The project would be approved to owners over the

The scores for Language Arts for third population came to 151 students who took the test and an 80.6 percent overall average score.

To improve scores of math, science and social studies, the BOE will be implementing a new curriculum for these subjects.

Impaired drivers killed nearly 17,000 people last year, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

Seitz said people planning to travel after drinking this weekend should choose a designated driver, take mass transit or call a cab or friend instead of driving themselves.

DWI checks in Journal Square

In an effort to combat drunk driving, Jersey City officials announced yesterday that police will be setting up sobriety checkpoints thanks to a grant from the state Division of Highway Safety.

Police will target drivers who are speeding, swerving and not wearing seatbelts, officials said.

A DWI roadside checkpoint will be set up in front of 54 Journal Square from 9 p.m. to 3 a.m. on Aug. 18, Aug. 25 and Sept. 1.

"Our message is simple — friends don't let friends drive drunk," Police Director Sam Jefferson said. "You drink, you drive, you lose."

Drunken drivers kill nearly

18,000 people nationwide each year, and in New Jersey, 39 percent of motor vehicle fatalities are alcohol-related, officials said.

Police will also pay special attention to shopping areas to ensure that drivers adhere to stop and yield signs, observe traffic signals and yield to pedestrians in crosswalks, officials said.

Caldwell police to launch 2006 campaign against drinking and driving

CALDWELL — As part of "You Drink and Drive, You Lose 2006 Statewide Crackdown," from Friday, Aug. 18 through Monday, Sept. 4, police will be stepping up impaired driving enforcement.

The goal of the program is to raise awareness about the dangers of drinking and driving through high-visibility enforcement and to arrest motorists who choose to drive while impaired by drugs or alcohol.

Before the end of August people often get together with their friends for one more party to say good-bye to another summer. In some cases people can have a little too much to drink and find themselves behind the wheel of a car.

Ex-track star gets jail for stabbing taxi driver

make more arrests and to be on the lookout for drunk drivers in an effort to save lives," said Police Chief Don Ingrasselino.
